Before installation, please make sure this Modbus Duo Box is compatible to your existing inverter.

This external box can provide more communication capability for the inverter to lithium battery and monitoring software. Here are the detailed functions:

- Via the communication between the inverter and lithium battery, it's able to re-configure
 the charging voltage, charging current, battery discharge cut-off voltage and max.
 discharge current based on the lithium battery parameters.
- Have unit start or stop charging depending on the status of lithium battery.
- Monitoring software


Special Precautions

2-1. Package Contents


Before installation, please inspect the unit. Be sure that nothing inside the package is damaged. You should have received the following items inside of package:





4-2. BMS Resistance Configuration




There are three bits (#6, #7 and #8) to configure the BMS resistance. From top to bottom, it's 1 to 8 as shown left. When the switch is pushed left, the bit is set to "OFF". Otherwise, the bit is set as "ON".

4-3. SW4 Reset


All of dip switches in SW4 should be switched to "OFF" or "ON" status.

4-4. Lithium battery communication configuration

 ADD Switch: There are 4 ADD switches on Lithium battery to define different baud rate and battery group address. If switch position is turned to bottom for "OFF" position, it means "0". If switch position is turned to upper for "ON" position, it means "1".



Dip 1 is "ON" to represent the baud rate 9600.

Dip 2, 3 and 4 are to set up battery group address.

Dip switch 2, 3 and 4 on master battery (first battery) are to set up or change the group address.

NOTE: "1" is upper position and "0" is bottom position.


NOTE: The maximum groups of lithium battery is 2 and for maximum number for each group, please check with battery manufacturer.

4-5. Active Function

This function is to activate lithium battery automatically while commissioning. After battery wiring and commissioning is successfully, if battery is not detected and active function is enabled in bundled software, the inverter will automatically activate battery if the inverter is powered on.


5. RS485-Monitor Configuration

5.1 Machine ID Configuration




There are eight bits to present ID of each box. Use SW1 to set machine ID. From top to bottom, it's 8 to 1. As shown, when the switch is pushed left as "ON" position, the value of this bit is set to "one". Otherwise, the value of the bit is set as zero when the switch is pushed to right as "OFF" position. The ID of modbus duo box is set to 0x01 as chart. Please check appendix for detailed ID no. and SW1 setting.



6. Connection and Operation


First, please use one RS-485 to RS-232 converter or RS-485 to Modbus/TCP converter as media converter between Modbus duo box and computer. Please follow below chart for wiring connection between R145 and media converter:

Then, follow chapter 4 and 5 to configure RS485-Monitor and BMS ports. After configuration, please install this box with inverter and Lithium battery by following below steps.

RS485-Monitor Port BMS Port (1) Use supplied RJ45(gray) cable to connect (1) Use supplied RJ45(gray) cable to Modbus duo box and the inverter. connect Modbus duo box and the inverter. (2) Use RS485 to RS 232 converter to connect (2) Use supplied RJ45(black) cable to Modbus Duo Box and PC. connect Modbus Duo Box and Lithium battery. RS485 to RS232 converter



After all wires are connected well and the communication between the inverter and battery is successful, it will show frame of battery icon () flashing or "Li" battery icon () lighting on the LCD screen.
